
CWS Presents Jean Grastorf, AWS, NWS, TWSA

Like many graphic artists, Tanis Bula dreaded trading in her magic markers to learn computerized design.

Of course, she had to master the computer, and it came in handy – but not just for graphic arts work. She also marketed her watercolor paintings online. One day in 2000, a Japanese art broker spotted her work on artmarketing.com and offered her a one-woman show in Japan.

She recalls whipping together 30 paintings in one spring for that first exhibit, which was repeated three years in a row. For each show, she went to Japan to sign her paintings (and plenty of autographs, too) in person. "I was treated like royalty," she remembers.

She had cut back on the day-to-day management of her graphic arts firm to pursue art seriously, and the Japanese shows kicked her watercolor career into high gear. Over time, she has exhibited prize-winning work in a long roster of one-woman shows, juried events, and corporate and gallery venues around Colorado.

Additionally, Tanis has earned signature status in the Colorado Watercolor Society and Rocky Mountain National Watercolor Society, and was profiled in the winter 2002 edition of Watercolor magazine. She also teaches watercolor two days a week (currently at the Grant Ranch Village Center in Littleton).

On her own, this busy artist paints a variety of subjects, but she's best known, perhaps, for her exquisite renderings of flowers. In brilliant, translucent hues, she aims to create "a moment in time – in nature the light and shadow are always forming complex shapes, textures, patterns and colors. As an artist I'm trying to cap-

ture these elements in my paintings."

Deep in work at her studio, in fact, "I feel like I'm living in the aspens, the irises, or whatever I'm painting," she says. "Sometimes I look up and say 'Where am I?'

Selling her work and deadlines for shows keep Tanis painting, and she's always looking for fresh marketing ideas. She'd like to see watercolor gain more stature as a painting medium, perhaps with more community-based venues for exhibiting art, along the lines of the Evergreen Art Center.

What lies ahead for Tanis? Inspired by artist Shirley Trevena's book Taking Risks in Watercolor, she's experimenting with texture in her watercolors by adding oil pastel and other media. Eventually, she'd like to give up graphic arts altogether, take more workshops and paint "large bodies of work."

"People ask me sometimes why I don't try oils," she says. "I tell them I haven't explored watercolor to its limits, yet, "she explains. "Or are there any limits?"


FALL CRAWL A SUCCESS


